### Progressive Era Begins

Movement that responded to the pressure of industry & urbanization & began reforms

People wanted to combat & correct why they saw as problems & injustices

Reformers sought to end corruption in the government & fix corruption in Big Business

Some wanted to fix the class system & work toward better living conditions.

#### Muckrakers

Journalists & writers who did investigations into the dirty, ugly side of America.

Lincoln Steffens- He wrote *The Shame of the Cities*, exposing corruption in major cities.

Jacob Riss – Used photography to capture poor urban lives & dangerous work conditions

**Upton Sinclair-** Wrote *The Jungle* that revealed the unsanitary conditions in the meat industry

### Impact on Society

Muckrakers increased support for progressivism & people began to improve living conditions

Social Gospel- The belief that people could make society "the kingdom of God" & help the common man

**Settlement House-** Community center that provided social services for the urban poor

Jane Addams became inspired by what she saw in London & brough social reform to the U.S. such as the ACLU.

#### Reforms in the World

Soon laws banning child labor became important eventually being sought in all states.

John Dewey believed schools needed to challenge students & adopt teaching of practical skills

The Triangle Shirtwaist Factory Fire shocked
Americans & called for work place reform

Soon laws limiting work hours began to become discussed as well as compensation laws

#### **Government Reform**

The Galveston plan eventually set up ideas for city governments & offices for utilities & safety

**Direct Primary-** Citizens vote for nominees for upcoming elections

Initiative- People could put a proposed law onto ballots for future election

Referendum- Citizens could approve or reject laws passed by a legislature.
