

The Aztecs

The Aztecs




Pre-Aztec States

Agriculture exploded as massive cities began to grown, such as the city of Palenque

This allowed new studies in stone architecture, mathematics, & astronomy

The first empire in the region was the Toltecs, whose culture would inspire the Mexica or Aztecs

Altepetls- Large territories in Central America controlled by Nauatl-speaking groups



Tenochtitlan

Tlatoani- Aztec rulers who exacted tribute in the form of labor, food, & fine goods

The city stretched for over 5 square miles & was home to 150,000 people

The city had 4 major roads that pointed to the 4 cardinal directions

Calpulli- Districts within the city, the elite lived near the center while the poor lived on the perimeters

Aztec Empire

Using fierce conquest & alliances, Aztec empire ruled across Mexico with 5-6 million people

Tribute- Payment from conquered people, helped enrich the Aztec capital

City was made up of floating gardens, zoos, palaces, becoming a city of wonder

Aztec had one ruler & a strong social class system for the empire

Religion & Mythology

Aztecs believed in many gods, but patron god was Huitzilopochtli, the hummingbird god of the sun

Aztecs also worshiped Quetzalcoatl, the feathered serpent, who ruled over earth & water

Teotihuacan- Massive city built to worship the gods at the Pyramid of the Sun & Pyramid of the Moon

Believed the gods created the world multiple times & offered human sacrifices

The Aztecs would engage in multiple wars to show dominance & supply sacrifices

Ceremony & Ritual

The Aztecs constructed a calendar to plan ritual & Priestly lords explained life, death, crops, & the movement of the stars

Toltecs & Aztecs believe that Quetzacoatl took the form of a human & would return to them one day

Some stories merge this with the arrival of the Spanish



Boys were gifted weapons upon birth, women were gifted weaving instruments & a small broom

Both genders would study in Houses of Youth for an education, but women prided themselves on becoming wives

Women worked in the homes & in markets while men trained for war

Knowledge & Discontent

Priests were the keepers of knowledge & used knowledge of astronomy & mathematics to tell the future

Built a math system based on 20 & developed a 260 AND 365 calendar systems

Believed illness was a punishment from gods, but still developed major medicines

The hatred that other tribes had towards the Aztecs would help Spain conquer the region
