Patriotism on the Home Front

To help fund the war, Americans bought war bonds, allowing citizens to save & invest.

The Office of Price administration controlled wages & set maximum

prices **Rationing** controlled food, rubber,

gasoline at home so goods could go

to the war effort The Office of War Information (OWI)

worked with the media to encourage support of the war Americans volunteered, worked overtime, sent care packages, and recycled.

- "Use it up, wear it out, make it do, or do without"

Japanese Internment

German, Italian, & Japanese aliens were subject to arrest or deportation if deemed dangerous to national security
- Germans & Italians held briefly in camps

Attack on Pearl Harbor caused a massive distrust of Japanese Americans

Executive Order 9066- Certain areas are war zones and anyone can be removed for any reason.

Japanese Americans are placed under internment (temporary imprisonment) & sent to camps.

44nd Regimental Combat Team fought in the Italian Campaign, most decorated military unit in U.S. history .

Women in the workforce

Women work in production at the home front, making up more than 1/3 of workforce

Women gain rights in the work place & work towards their own "American Dream"

Rosie the Riveter became an icon for women who made war materials

Women in the workforce increased fivefold & the federal government began to invest in daycares

African American Rights

African American leaders favored a "Double V campaign"...

Victory against fascism & victory against discrimination at home

A. Philip Randolph presented Roosevelt with a list of demands to end discrimination in government workforce

Executive Order 8802- Fair Employment Practices in any job funded by the government

Migration During WW2

People began to flood the cities & California to find jobs in wartime industries

Demographics- Statistics that show human characteristics of a population

Mexican migrates came to the U.S. under the bracero program- bringing laborers to work on farms in the West

Racial conflicts erupted across the nation such as the Zoot-Suit Riots- Group of sailors attack Mexican populations of Los Angeles
