England's First Colonies

Sir Walter Raleigh seeks wealth in the New World

Obtains a Charter (certificate or permission) to form a

Joint-Stock Company- Investors join to split profits

Tries to colonize Roanoke, but fails & second group of settlers disappears



The Virginia Company settles the region & forms Jamestown.

John Smith comes into contact with the Algonquian tribe & Chief Powhatan

War eventually breaks out & English capture Amonute (Pocohontas)

The Colony Grows

People are allowed to own & work private lands & tobacco becomes a cash crop!

The House of Burgesses- The 1st representative body of Gov. in America- gives the colony a system of Government



Royal Colonies- Belong to Crown

Proprietary Colonies- Belong to Companies or individuals

Expansion & Conflict

The Algonquin Tribes fight back, unable to stop English colonization

Bacon's Rebellion- Nathaniel Bacon leads a group of farmers to kill off tribes & fight for farmer rights against Virginia

The Southern Colonies

Five Colonies begin- Maryland, Virginia, North & South Carolina, & Georgia

Lord Baltimore founds Maryland as a Catholic refuge

Carolinas created to honor King Charles II.

James Oglethorpe forms Georgia to protect colonies against Spain & for English debtors
