Roots of the Holocaust

The aim of The Holocaust was the mass murder of Jews and other "undesirables"

The Nazi movement followed Anti-Semitism ideals

The Nuremberg Laws segregated Jews to every level of German society

Kristallnact (Nov. 9th, 1938) was a massive attack on German Jews

Jews tried to flee country, but faced hurdles

Hitler's "Final Solution"

Hitler opens concentration camps to confine designated groups

People were forced into work or suffered experiments

The Wannsee Conference outlined a plan to systematically exterminate the Jewish population

Many concentration camps were designated as "Death Camps."

As many as 6 million Jews and 5 million others were killed during The Holocaust

The Allied Response

FDR establishes the War Refugee Board with the Red Cross to rescue Jews.

The horrors of The Holocaust only became real to some after the liberation of some camps

In 1948 the nation of Israel was founded, supported by President Truman
