Ancient Israelites

Monotheistic- Belief in only 1 god, The Hebrews believed in this

The Torah- Sacred text of the Israelites that they follow

Abraham- Believed to be the father of the Israelites, settled the region based on the word of God

Covenant- Promise & Agreement

God chose the Hebrews as his people.
That Canaan would become the promised land

Hebrew Faith

Believed that Moses saved the Hebrew slaves in Egypt & lead the people to the Holy Land

King David, establishes Jerusalem as the national capital & created Israel

King Solomon turns Jerusalem into a massive capital.

Israel collapses and the Kingdom of Judah remain, become The Jews

Judaism's Legacy

Patriarchal- Men hold the greatest legal & moral authority

Follow the 10 Commandments as central to the faith

Sabbath- Holy day for rest & worship

Spiritual leaders in history, known as prophets, would remind Jewish people of their duties

Ethics- Moral standards of behavior

Spread of Religion

Main belief was the rich and powerful were supposed to protect the weak & all people equal in eyes of God

Diaspora- The spreading out of the Jewish People

Eventually Jewish customs would form the foundation for the Christian religion
